**Position Descriptions:**

The Child Development and Family Studies (CDFS) program in the Department of Technology, Learning, and Culture is seeking to fill two tenure-track positions to begin fall 2008. Position 1 will be at the entry-level assistant professor level, and Position 2 at the assistant/associate level. Both positions are nine-months. One position will be focused in early childhood and the other in adolescence with expertise in family studies desired for both positions. Additionally, applicants whose scholarly interests bridge young children, adolescents, and families and educational settings are of particular interest. Starting date is August 16, 2008. Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience.

**Responsibilities:**

- Teach undergraduate and graduate courses in child development and family studies.
- Advise and provide guidance to CDFS undergraduates.
- Mentor CDFS graduate students and supervise master's theses.
- Serve on graduate committees in the department and college.
- Establish a viable research program and engage in scholarly activities with outcomes in the form of peer-reviewed publications in media of high quality.
- Provide professional and public service.
- Coordinate and administer undergraduate program in CDFS (assistant/associate position).

**Qualifications for Positions:**

- Doctorate in child or adolescent development, human development, family studies, early childhood education, or related field.
- Expertise in infancy/early childhood or adolescence with ability to teach family studies classes.
- Strong potential to secure research funding, develop and conduct research, and publish in scholarly outlets.
